For €29.99 per month, the Freebox "Multiplay" service, which is available subject to the suitability of the line in areas where the local loop has been unbundled, allows subscribers:

- to access the Internet via a very high bandwidth connection (6 Mbit/s download, 512 kbit/s upload),
- to have a telephone line which includes unlimited telephone calls to fixed network telephones in mainland France,
- to watch more than 100 digital quality television channels on their television, about sixty of which are included in the fixed price package.

Using Freebox, subscribers in 200,000 homes regularly watch Free's broadband television service.

"Broadband and the latest broadcast technologies are at the heart of the Turner group's broadcasting strategy and we are very pleased to be able to broadcast our content to Freebox subscribers", says Michael Riley, Vice President and General Manager of TBS France.
