**Free taking its internet users to the heart
of the latest political and parliamentary developments:**

**24-hour LCP–Assemblée nationale channel
available for the first time on television with Freebox TV**

With the 24-hour version of LCP-Assemblée nationale, Free is enabling a very strong focus on political and parliamentary life. As of today, Free internet users will be able to discover all of the channel's parliamentary, political and citizen programs, while enjoying real-time and uninterrupted access to the French National Assembly's parliamentary debates and work.

Free is the first operator to enable its ADSL subscribers to access the 24-hour version of LCP-Assemblée nationale on their televisions.

“Being present on the Freebox TV ADSL service is in line with our strategy, looking to communicate on parliamentary and political life as widely as possible”, confirms Richard Michel, the Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of LCP-Assemblée nationale.

The LCP-Assemblée nationale channel is currently broadcast alternating with the Public Sénat channel on digital terrestrial television (DTT) channel 13, on all cable-satellite packages and on ADSL.

In this way, LCP-Assemblée nationale will now also be broadcasting round the clock on a dedicated Freebox TV channel (Channel 90).

*The Freebox TV is available subject to telephone line eligibility.
This channel is included in Freebox TV package.*
