## **Free Mobile: Femtocells now available for Freebox Revolution subscribers**

Subscribers with a Freebox Revolution will now be offered a femtocell box.

These mini-boxes fit into the Freebox Revolution and act as a personal 3G base station. They are the ideal solution for subscribers encountering difficulties with Free mobile reception in their homes.

As the Freebox Revolution was designed from the outset to integrate a femtocell, all Freebox Revolutions currently installed at subscribers' homes can be fitted with a Freebox Femto.

Obtaining a Femto is easy – it is included\* in the Freebox Revolution subscription and is available to any Freebox Revolution subscriber who submits a request via their Freebox subscriber interface ([free.fr](http://free.fr) > “My account”).

The Femto is discreet and easy to install as it does not require any cable connections or any specific activation. Connection from subscribers' mobile phones to the Femto is automatic when they are near a Freebox Revolution fitted with a Femto.

This first generation of Freebox Femtos will evolve in the future with a view to meeting an even wider range of consumer needs and offering ever-more innovative services.
