## **Mobile communications in foreign countries and the French Overseas Departments (international roaming)**

- **Free reduces its prices for nearly 200 destinations (for voice, SMS, MMS and data)**
- **Within the European Union, Free positions itself below the ceilings set by the European Commission for all forms of communication**

Free has reduced the price of international communications (voice, SMS, MMS and data) sent or received for a large number of destinations (foreign countries and the French Overseas Departments). These price reductions will apply from July 1, 2013 for all Free mobile subscribers. For example:

- In the Maghreb region, the price of local calls and calls to France will be reduced to €0.95/minute, representing **decreases of 67% for calls in Tunisia** (local and to France) and 46% for calls in Morocco (local and to France).

- In Switzerland, the price of calls within the country and to France **will fall by 32% to €0.34/minute.**

**Within the European Union, Free's prices will be lower than the ceilings set by the European Commission** for all forms of communication (voice, SMS, MMS and data).

For example, in Spain and Italy local calls and calls to France **will be reduced by 32% to €0.23/minute**, which is **20% cheaper than the EU ceiling** of €0.29/minute.

For the French Overseas Departments, the price of calls within the Departments and to France will come down to €0.27/minute, again below the €0.29/minute EU ceiling.
