Corinne Vigreux joins Iliad's Board of Directors as an Independent Board Member

Iliad's shareholders have elected Corinne Vigreux as an independent member of the Board of Directors for a term of four years.

The Board of Directors now comprises 11 members, 5 of whom are independent directors.

Corinne Vigreux is co-founder of TomTom and Managing Director of its consumer business.

Having graduated from the ESSEC Business School (BBA 1987) in Paris, she began her career in London at Psion, one of the first successful European technology start-ups, where she built the company's international distribution network across the world.

In 1991, she moved to the Netherlands where together with Harold Goddijn, Peter-Frans Pauwels and Pieter Geelen in 1992 she founded Palmtop Software, which later became TomTom. Assuming responsibility for branding, marketing and sales, she oversaw the change from a B2B software publisher company to a world leading B2C organization.

The first TomTom stand-alone navigating device was released in March 2004. TomTom is the only European consumer electronics company to have created a global brand within the last 15 years. Corinne Vigreux subsequently led TomTom's entry into GPS sport watches and more recently launched the TomTom Bandit, an innovative action camera. As a leader in technology innovation, TomTom is also playing a major role in making Highly Automated Driving and Autonomous Driving a reality by creating cutting-edge technology for mapping systems in applications for self-driving vehicles.

Corinne Vigreux is passionate about social mobility and education; in 2005 she set up her own foundation dedicated to these causes, the Sofronie foundation, which she chairs. She is also on the advisory board of the Sutton Trust.

In parallel, she is on the Board of the French Chamber of Commerce and Industry in the Netherlands (CFCI), a member of the Conseil de Coopération Franco-

Néerlandais (CCFN), and president of the Conseiller du Commerce extérieur de la France (CCEF). She is also a member of the supervisory board of the Dutch National Opera & Ballet. She plays an active role in support of women in leadership, co-chairing the Dutch chapter of Women Corporate Directors.

Corinne Vigreux was voted one of the top fifty most inspirational women in European tech in 2015 and 2016.

In 2012, she was decorated by the French State as a Knight of the Legion of Honour for her business success and social commitment.
