For the FIFA World Cup 2018™, which kicks off on June 14, TF1 – the official French broadcaster of the event – will broadcast the **competition's 28 best matches in 4K** on the **Freebox mini 4K**.

There's nothing better than 4K (ultra-high definition) to bring the big-match atmosphere right into your home!

TF1 4K (channel 101) is available and included in their package for fiber subscribers who have the mini 4K Player (under either (i) the Freebox mini 4K Plan, or (ii) the Freebox Revolution with TV by CANAL Panorama Plan/the Freebox Revolution Plan with the multi-TV mini 4K option).

The first match to be broadcast in 4K will be the competition's opening game on June 14 (Russia vs Saudi Arabia).

TF1 4K will also be broadcasting **three Formula 1 Grand Prix races in 4K:**

- The French Grand Prix on June 24, 2018
- The Belgian Grand Prix on August 26, 2018
- The Italian Grand Prix on September 2, 2018

Access to the TF1 4K channel only available for subscribers with a fiber connection and a compatible television. Since January 2012, Free has brought mobile phone usage within everyone's reach with straightforward, no-commitment offerings at very attractive prices.
